

What is Cor?

Every Catholic man needs a strong relationship with God that is rooted in prayer and the sacraments to live his faith and engage in the mission of the Church. Men also need a band of brothers that encourages them to deepen their faith, build strong relationships, hold each other accountable, and learn from each other.

The Knights of Columbus *Cor* program exists to address these needs. It is designed to help men proactively invest in their ongoing faith formation, to be a part of a dynamic brotherhood that supports, sharpens, and strengthens them to be holy men, husbands, fathers, brothers, and sons, and to engage in the mission of the Church.

Each *Cor* gathering includes three key elements – prayer, formation, and fraternity. Sessions typically begin with a light meal and an opportunity for conversation. Then we move on to the main topic, which often involves scripture reading, followed by small group discussions on what we've read and how it relates to our lives and our roles as men.



Be strong and be a man! – 1 Kings 2:2

Cor is open to all Catholic men (18 +) regardless of background, Catholic education, or knowledge. It is for men who are humble before God. It is for men who want to grow in discipleship and be the men God created them to be. It is for men who understand that other people in their lives are depending on them to be a man of prayer and a man of God.
